## FROM THE PASTOR - "GOSPEL COMMUNITIES"

At the May meeting of Utica Presbytery yesterday evening (5/23), Larry Beasley, our Presbytery Clerk, used a strange term. Instead of using the word, "churches," he said "gospel communities." Larry and I first heard the term at the Synod gathering this winter for presbytery leaders. Synod leader, Harold DelHagen, said he had begun using the new terminology for several reasons.

People are used to talking about churches with primary reference to a building. We say, "The Presbyterian Church is on Court Street by the police station." We talk about "going to church" on Sunday to worship. Despite having learned the old song that says, "I am the church; you are the church; we are the church together," we still think that way. Harold wants us all to begin using language that speaks of a community of people who gather to live out the gospel. The language we use shapes the way we think. If we talk about "church" primarily as a place, or a something we do in a certain building, we think of "church" as something limited to only one, small segment of our lives.

On the other hand, if we talk about the life of a "gospel community," we promote the idea of things we do to serve God and our neighbors rather than a building or a place. The term Harold introduced to us implies that the followers of Jesus are people who go out and embody the Gospel, people who put the Gospel into practice and live it out in the world.

Harold's language challenges the anxiety that drives a lot of church talk these days. People who see their worship attendance and membership rolls shrinking, can easily think that the main thing they should do is get new people to come sit in the church building and give money so we can continue to do what we've always done. What if the main thing is to go out and live the Gospel in new ways in our communities? What if the purpose of the church is to serve the world rather than to assure the survival of our institution?

I'm not saying that we should get rid of worship or our sanctuary or our inspiring music. Our worship life is one thing that lifts us up, inspires us and empowers us to go out and be a Gospel Community in the world. We need both our shared spiritual life and the life of service to neighbors.

In order to do that, the pastor and the Session need everyone's ideas and need people who are willing to lead, organize and serve together. If the talk of being a "gospel community" inspires you, please share your ideas about ways we can be one in Rome and serve our neighbors, making this city a stronger community and lifting up everyone who lives here, especially those most in need. That's one way we can follow the Way of our Lord.
