PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

"The beginning of the good news of Jesus Christ, the Son of God." Mark 1:1

Our gospel readings this church year come from the book of Mark. It was the first gospel to be written and right from the beginning of his account he makes a bold claim that Jesus is the Son of God. Again, at the end of Mark's gospel, the centurion soldier at the foot of the cross of Jesus will make the same claim. Mark poses a question for us to ponder during this Lenten season. What does it mean for us that Jesus is the Christ (Messiah/Savior) the Son of God? To make this confession requires a journey deep within. Lent is the perfect time to journey into what this faith statement means. It is a time to journey into the heart of God. And journeys of all kinds require some kind of change. It's what the word repentance means, to change or turn around.

Pondering on this journey of Lent, I thought about Henry Nouwen, Dutch Catholic priest, professor, writer, theologian, and a writer who has been a spiritual mentor of mine. His own spiritual journey was filled with a lot of change. One particular lifechanging event was his involvement in the Daybreak L'Arche community in Trosly, France. L'Arche, meaning the Ark was initially formed in the French commune of Trosly-Breuil in 1964 by Jean Vanier, Raphaël Simi, and Philip Seux as a reaction and community-based alternative to the ill-treatment and dismal living conditions in the psychiatric institutions of the 1960s. Since then, it has expanded to over 150 communities in 38 countries worldwide. Henry Nouwen was first invited to visit there for about six weeks in 1985. After returning to his teaching position at Harvard, he felt called to resign and spend another year at L'Arche and eventually stayed there until is death in 1996. That initial visit was life-changing, and it taught him to slow down, and as he said, to "draw closer to the heart of God" through life in community.

Leaving his position at Harvard wasn't a decision he expected and shook quite a few people up, but he heard that call from God and answered. Our amazing secretary Kari's retirement announcement has shaken us up too. But when you hear the call of God to change directions, you need to answer that call. God is with us through the changes in our life and throughout our journey. That's why this Lent we will be learning a new song entitled, "Lord Jesus, You Shall Be My Song." The song was created in 1961 by members of Les Petites Soeurs de Jésus ("The Little Sisters of Jesus"), a global contemplative order that "seeks to be a sign of love to people who are rejected." The hymn also has associations with the L'Arche communities that changed Henry Nouwen's life. It is both a promise to bear witness to the love of Christ, and a prayer for courage throughout life's journey. I hope you will come to love it as much as I do.

As we journey closer to the heart of God this Lent through community as Nouwen did, may this song take root in us so that we will be able to experience and share with certainty that Jesus truly is the Christ, the Son of God. "Lord Jesus, you shall be my song as I journey; I'll tell everybody about you wherever I go: you alone are our life and our peace and our love. Lord Jesus, you shall be my song as I journey."


BLACK HISTORY MONTH
