PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

"Jesus said to her, 'I am the resurrection and the life. Those wno velieve in me, even though they die, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die.'" (John 11:25-26)

There's a lot going on in the month of March – St. Patrick's Day, March Madness, and the first day of spring to name a few. A lot's been written about the month of March as well. The old saying, "March comes in like a lion and goes out like a lamb," is quite a familiar one, that I'm sure you've all heard. It began as a statement regarding the weather that March often brings. It begins with a lot of storms and wind, but as the month ends things quiet down. However, that's not always the case depending on where in the country you live. As we've seen here in Upstate NY, the weather can be pretty fierce even well past March.

This saying however, has me pondering about how it applies to the Church calendar, especially this year during March. We begin this month still in the quiet, reflective, and prayerful season of Lent. We are meditating on Jesus' suffering and death and how he has been called the Lamb of God, because of the sacrifice of his life so we would have eternal life. And as the month goes on we move from the reflection of Lent to the triumphant entry of Jesus on Palm Sunday, to the drama of Holy Week, the heartbreak of denial and Jesus' last meal with his disciples on Maundy Thursday, the pain of Good Friday, and finally the joyous excitement and celebration of Easter. The last day of March we will be celebrating Jesus' resurrection. We will then proclaim with joy how the Lamb of God overcame death and the grave and sing with joy about the victorious risen King of Kings. (And I'm not talking about the Lion King!) In the Christian church this year, "March comes in like a lamb and goes out like a lion." That's quite a reversal from the original saying.

Jesus' message however is all about reversals. The Church is called to be counter-cultural. We are called to follow Jesus and his way of turning things upside-down. Jesus went against the status quo. "The first shall be last." (Matt. 19:30). "When I am weak, then I am strong." (2 Cor. 12:9-10) And in the Beatitudes (Matt. 5:1-12)

Jesus contrasts radically with the values and attitudes generally accepted in Jesus' context, as well as denouncing the oppressive and unjust practices and systems of that time. As follows of Christ, the Church is called to do the same. As we enter into the month of March, we do so knowing that our journey in Lent will soon be turned upside down. We reflect on the pain, suffering, and death that Jesus endured knowing that death was turned upside down through his resurrection. And that's a turn worth celebrating!





SERENITY MESSAGE FROM MICHELLE

Everything as it moves, now and then, here and there, makes pauses. The bird as it flies stops in one place to make its nest, and in another to rest in its flight.

In the same way, God has paused as well. The trees, the animals, the sun and stars, are all places where God has stopped, leaving the touch of the Holy in all these things.

We, too, have had God pause in us.

We too have the Holy touch in our beings.

With each star and planet, plant and animal,
let us pause from our daily tasks and praise our Creator......from: Prayers for the Earth

Friends, We have entered the Lenten season. Our time to pause. A time for reflection, meditation, & prayer. A time when we are encouraged to cultivate our connection with & understanding of God. Prayer is often thought of as speaking to God, but it also involves listening to God. Making time each day to be quiet, & to be with God can enrich our experiences and relationships and deepen our connection to our Creator. God is the constant, but the rest of the world continues to change. The Word of God is living & moving through our lives and always with us! Prayer changes us.

An eagle flies not by constantly fluttering and flapping their wings... but they unfurl their wings and catch a breeze. When an eagle perches on a tree branch with her wings locked tight at her sides, no wind will lift her. But if she just unfurls her wings a little bit, she may find the wind to catch her. The Hebrew word for wind is Ru'ah. It is onomatopoetic. When it is spoken you hear the wind. You also hear breath. Ru'ah means wind and it means breath and it also means Spirit.

Now us human beings – how do we fly? — *not* by constant flutters and flaps... we unfurl our wings and catch the Spirit. And we glide on — not relying on our own strength but in the work of the Spirit lifting us up, sustaining us. We may swoop and play and rejoice in the work of the Spirit. We have been made for this relationship of self and Spirit. So, the Lenten invitation to us is to pause, especially when we are weary, tired, impatient, frustrated. This is the time to shake loose our wings and swoop them open wide. Knowing that the Holy Spirit is at work, *catching us up in a movement greater than our own strength*.

Here is a prayer to feel closer to God:

God of life, God of hope, God of all, Lift me on your love like eagle's wings. Sustain me, Guide me, Heal me. Then send me forth into the world, that I may always trust that you are walking with me, and that I may love as you love. Amen. Zoom Broadcast: We'll be moving our Sunday Worship Service broadcast to Zoom in the late spring. To most of us this will be "old hat" as we use Zoom for committee meetings, Faith Formation classes and Serenity Circle. For those of you who will be using Zoom for the first time, please contact the church office to let us know. We will continue to post our services to Youtube, and will begin to post to Facebook, so that you are still able to watch the videos about an hour after the service concludes! We're excited and hope you are too!!
