Growing in Faith

We all know what it feels like to be weary. Last July, we experienced a devastating tornado. The winter brought crushing snow. Spring brought a deluge of rain and flooding. This summer has begun with more storms. And we have experienced significant deaths in our congregation, most recently the sudden death of our beloved former secretary and friend, Kari Ketchum. I think it's fair to say that we are all a bit weary at this point.

It's been a tough year, a challenging season for all of us. A new season, however, has also begun, a season of growth. On June 8th the Church season of Pentecost began. It's the longest season of the Church year ending on Christ the King Sunday right before the season of Advent. This year the season of Pentecost will last for 24 weeks or six months! The color associated with this season is green symbolizing growth. What will we as Jesus' disciples grow this season? There are many seeds to plant and grow: kindness, love, compassion, mercy, justice, service, unity.....

Just as the summer season is a time of increased growth for flowers and vegetables, the season of Pentecost is an opportunity to focus on increased growth in our faith. It's a time to draw closer in relationship with the Holy Spirit who guides, teaches, and draws us closer to the heart of God. No matter where we are – in worship, at home, at work, on vacation- we can find time to pray and be aware of the presence of God in our lives. Being mindful and aware of God's presence gives us strength to persevere in challenging times and to "not grow weary in doing what is right." This is what strengthens our faith.

During this season of Pentecost we will be focusing in worship together on what it means to live as Jesus' disciples. In August, I'll be giving a four-part sermon series focusing on faith from the lectionary texts from the Book

of Hebrews. We will be reminded of the strength

of our ancestors in faith, and how they found the strength to persevere.

This season of Pentecost be on the lookout for the many ways the Holy Spirit is at work in our lives in unexpected places, people, and situations. Share this news with those around you. "Do not grow weary in doing what is right for we will reap at harvest time if we don't give up."

# RELAY FOR LIFE NEWS TEAM OF RAINBOWS OF FAITH & HOPE



Dear Friends,

God finds us. Even when we try to hide, when we believe we aren't worthy, when we aren't looking. The wisdom that existed before the world was created is infused into every molecule of our being. And when we start to notice God's presence – that wisdom is activated!

What makes it so surprising is that it's not what we picture wisdom to be in this modern world. It's not some aged person, long white hair, wearing a flowing robe, sitting stoically on a mountain top, possessing great knowledge, speaking softly, their words sparse and solemn and mysterious.

Wisdom is joyful! Celebratory! Delights in life! Wisdom is in our hearts – not our minds! When we are young, we are taught that we should be prudent, approach things intellectually, be discerning. 
