PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

It's hard to believe that summer is almost over! Where did it go? Church building restoration underway, meetings, preparing for the fall schedule... I find myself wishing I could push a rewind button and go back to the beginning of summer so I could have more time to relax. I'm sure I'm not the only one who feels this way. Maybe you too, have not had as much time to relax as you'd hoped, and you're wishing for more time. It's so easy to look at the past and wish we could go back and change things. Yet, we can't stop time. We can't go back, and we can't jump into the future. The time we need to focus on is now. St. Paul in his Letter to the Church in Philippi says, "...One thing I have laid hold of: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead I press on toward the goal, toward the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus." We can even dwell on past mistakes in the same way, and become so focused on what we did wrong that we can't move forward. It's why we begin our worship services with the Confession and Pardon because we admit where we've gone wrong, and receiving God's forgiveness we move forward. The forgiveness and grace that God pours out on us is what we can hold onto. Holding onto the past mistakes, the "what if's" and "should haves" only block the grace that is given to us. It only keeps us stuck in the past unable to move forward in the direction God's Spirit is moving us. And that direction - like the plants and flowers in nature - is to constantly reach toward the Son.

By straining forward toward the Son of God we grow and bloom and spread the love and compassion and the grace of God to all. In the challenging times we live in, this is needed now more than ever.

Yes, summer is quickly winding down and a new season will soon be here, but there's no need to push the re-wind button. We can take time right now and enjoy the beauty of each day. We can set aside a little more time for relaxing now. What better way than to savor our Sundays by setting aside an hour or so each week to come together and worship and pray as a community of faith. A time where collectively we can ask for strength to be Christ's hands and feet in this world in order to ease the burdens of others so that all of us can breathe a little easier and relax a little deeper.

You might be wondering -- "What's going on with Plentiful Gifts? We haven't heard anything for a while."


Well, it's been summer, and you know how church routines slow down in summer.
