PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

"But ask the animals, and they will teach you, or the birds in the sky, and they will tell you, or speak to the earth, and it will teach you, or let the fish in the sea inform you." Job 12:7-8



Several things come to mind as October approaches. Among them are brilliant fall foliage, autumn flowers, pumpkins, cooler temperatures, time change, stewardship, Halloween, and Reformation. The Blessing of the Animals is also another one of my most favorite autumn events for several reasons. It happens out in nature; all different kinds of animals are drawn together, and there's a tangible wisdom in the air. The scripture texts from Job are usually read that tell us that there is much we can learn from listening to the animals, birds, fish, and earth itself. They contain an ancient wisdom that humans often don't hear because we don't take the time to listen. The Blessing of the Animals service is one of those opportunities where we can do just that.



All the creatures in nature and earth itself are more in sync with the rhythm of the seasonal changes. They know, sooner than we do, when the temperatures will change, how to prepare for winter, and how to communicate with one another. The arrival of the change of seasons - particularly autumn - alerts animals to prepare and adapt to the changes about to happen. Many birds migrate to warmer climates. Some start storing food for the long winter months. Other animals burrow underground or go into a stage called dormancy. They prepare for the changes without anxiety or panic. They simply know it's part of the cycle

of the seasons. We can learn so much from nature, earth, and the many creatures about adaptability, flexibility, stewardship, celebration, and yes, even reformation and transformation. They do not worry about what is to come; they simply trust in the Creator. There is indeed so much that we can learn from all of them if we simply pause long enough and spend time in the natural world. It's part of stewardship and honoring God by caring for all God has made. The earth and all its creatures are not ours; all belongs to God, and we have a responsibility to love and care for all that has been entrusted to us. Giovanni di Pietro di Bernardone, most commonly known as St. Francis of Assisi, believed that nature itself was "the mirror of God." He called all creatures his "brothers" and "sisters." He understood they possessed the pure wisdom of God not tainted by human distortions. I hope to see you all at this year's Blessing of the Animals whether you have a pet or not. Come, see, and witness the wisdom they bring.



Our Abolitionist Roots

There were twenty Welsh churches in Oneida and Lewis Counties. Under the leadership of Rev. Robert Everett, the

churches took an anti-slavery stance. Everett formed several anti-slavery societies among the Welsh community. He published a Welsh-language newspaper that had national and international circulation. Everett's home near Remsen was a stop on the Underground Railroad.

Southern Oneida County was particularly committed to anti-slavery. The Hanover Congregational Church strongly denounced slavery and urged banning slavery supporters from the pulpit and communion table. The Sauquoit Presbyterian Church hosted an anti-slavery society after the group had been refused use of the Methodist Church.

Transformational Trails

Together, curiosity, compassion, and active listening form the foundation of trauma-informed care. Curiosity opens the door to understanding, compassion ensures that understanding is grounded in care rather than judgment, and active listening makes both possible in real time. Practiced together, they shift our way of



engaging from simply knowing about trauma to truly embodying a way of being that honors dignity, fosters safety, and creates space for healing.

Reducing/Eliminating Fossil Fuels

The Presbytery of Utica is partnering with **ReWire Energy** in Saratoga Springs (https://rewireenergy.com/) to reduce or eliminate our dependency on fossil fuels. The first two parts of the project:

NYSERDA Energy Audits. ReWire will coordinate level one energy audits with an NYSERDA certified auditor at no cost to congregations of the Presbytery of Utica. The audit report will help congregations determine recommended energy improvements make the most sense for the congregation.

Community Solar Program. ReWire has organized a program whereby congregations can purchase their electricity from a local solar farm. There is no cost to join the program, and no additional equipment needed. First Presbyterian Church of Holland Patent is the first congregation to commit to participating in the community solar program; while there will be incremental dollar savings over the course of the year, the church will reduce its carbon footprint by approximately 6.6 metric tons of CO₂ annually.

As more congregations join the program, the churches of the Presbytery of Utica can have a tremendous impact on reducing the amount of carbon dioxide we introduce into the atmosphere—and increase shalom for ourselves and for the land.
